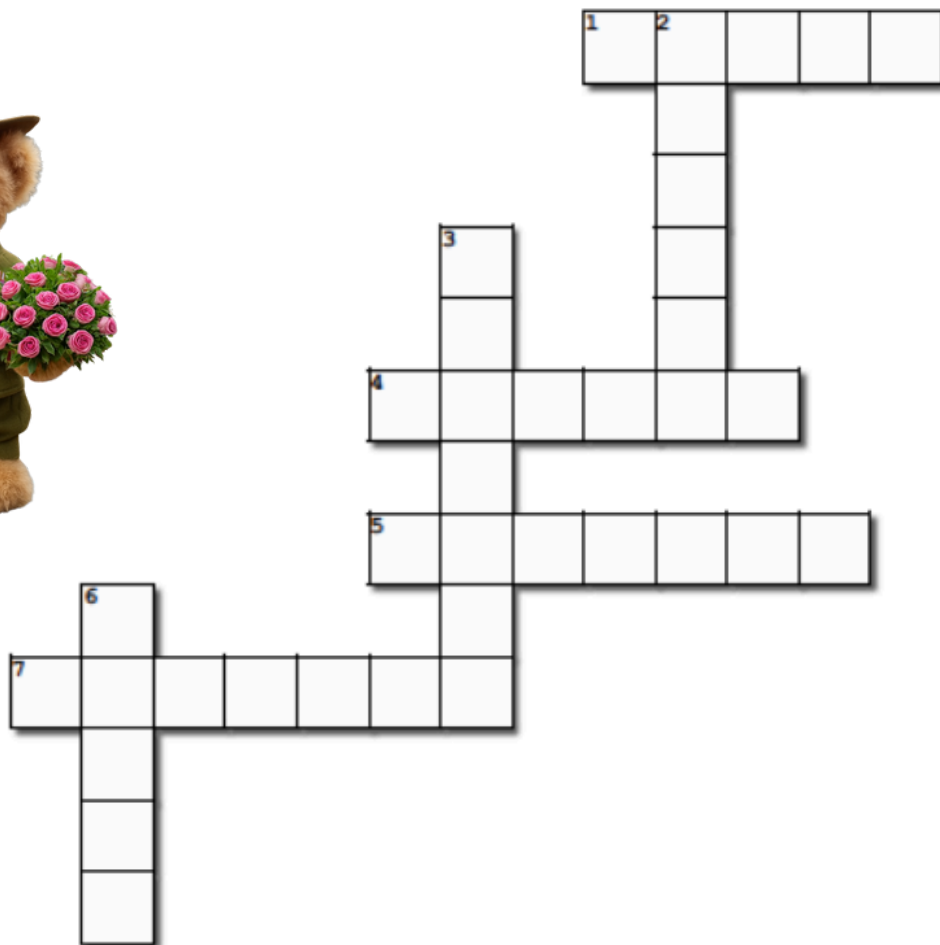
HELLFIRE PASS

Hellfire Pass was a section of the Thailand-Burma Railway, constructed during the Second World War by prisoners of war (POWs) and forced labourers under extreme conditions. They were forced to cut through solid stone using only hand tools such as pickaxes. The railway, which ran alongside rivers and through tunnels, was a vital supply route but came at an immense human cost.



HORIZONTAL

- (S) A hard rock that prisoners of war and forced labourers had to break to build the railway.
- (J) A place with many trees and plants, like a forest, near Hellfire Pass.
- (R) The tracks that trains use to carry people and goods.
- (P) A tool with a sharp end, like a hammer, used for breaking rocks.

VERTICAL

- (T) A long, dark hole dug through a mountain or big hill for people or trains to go through.
- (C) Showing bravery when something is difficult or scary.
- (R) A long stream of water that moves and is used for travelling and drinking.
